



Percent of Students in the City of Fort Worth that Met and Approached Grade Level Standards by Grade on Spring 2021 STAAR 3-8 Exams


Percent of Students in the City of Fort Worth that Met and Approached Grade Level Standards by Subject on Spring 2021 STAAR 3-8 Exams









Percent of Students that Met and Approached Grade Level Standards by School on Spring 2021 STAAR 3-8 Exams





Percent of Students that Met and Approached Grade Level Standards by School on Spring 2021 STAAR 3-8 Exams





Percent of Students that Met and Approached Grade Level Standards by School on Spring 2021 STAAR 3-8 Exams







Spring 2019 Spring 2021 Percent of Students that Met and Approached Grade Level Standards by School on Spring 2021 STAAR 3-8 Exams







Student Achievement Data Comparison from Spring 2019 and Spring 2021 STAAR





Percent of Students that Met and Approached Grade Level Standards by School on Spring 2021 STAAR 3-8 Exams





- Students Met grade level standards 17% of the time. This represents an 10 percentage point decrease in comparison to Spring 2019.
- Students Approached grade level standards 25% of the time. This represents a 6 percentage point decrease.

Percent of Students that Met and Approached Grade Level Standards by School on Spring 2021 STAAR 3-8 Exams







Appendix

General Notes

- Percentages represent the aggregation of data for all subject tests taken across all grade levels. Meaning, the
 percentages shown represent the percentage of assessments that were taken and passed by 'Meeting' or
 'Approaching' Grade-Level standards, across all grade-levels and all 3-8 STAAR exams combined within a specific
 school or City Council District.
- Enrollment data by school system and/or type of school is from School Year 2019-2020.

Geographic Boundaries

- For each City Council District, geographic boundaries were determined using maps from https://www.fortworthtexas.gov/government/districts, overlayed with school site locations from TEA's School Locator Map, found at https://tea-texas.maps.arcgis.com/apps/webappviewer/index.html? id=51f0c8fa684c4d399d8d182e6edd5d97.
- Analysis included public schools that were open in School Year 2020-2021 and located within the geographic boundaries of the council district, except schools that are rated on alternative standards.

Data Analysis

- STAAR 3-8 data is downloaded from TEA's texasassessment.gov portal, found at https://txreports.emetric.net/.
- School and Council Distict Data includes results from all 3-8 STAAR subject exams (Reading, Math, Writing, Science and Social Studies) taken in both English and Spanish.
- This data does not include results from STAAR 3-8 Alternate exams or STAAR End of Course exams.
