

Percentage of Students Meeting Grade Level Standard





Appendix

General Notes

- Percentages indicate the percentage of assessments that received a 'Meets Grade Level' or above performance standard across all 3-8 STAAR and STAAR Spanish exams taken within a school or Council District.
- Enrollment data is from School Year 2023-2024 Student Program and Special Populations PEIMS Reports, as reported by TEA.¹
- All public schools open in School Year 2023-2024, containing at least one grade level within 3-8 and located within the geographic boundaries of the council district were included in published test results, except for those registered for Alternative Education Accountability.
- All public schools open in School Year 2023-2024 and located within the geographic boundaries of the council district were included in enrollment counts regardless of grade levels or AEA designation.

Geographic Boundaries

- For each City Council District, geographic boundaries were determined using maps from the City of Fort Worth² overlayed with school site locations from TEA's School Locator Map.³ If the map overlay was close or unclear, the City's 'One Address' tool was used to verify the city council district.⁴
- The City of Fort Worth implemented new City Council District boundaries in Spring 2023, including the addition of 2 new City Council districts. For longitudinal Council District comparisons, all campuses are included as if they were always located in the current Council District, to allow for an apples-to-apples comparison.
- Some campuses have changed locations over the years. Longitudinal data that shows performance across years includes campuses that were in that council district during that year, even if no longer located within that council district.

Data Analysis

- STAAR and STAAR Spanish 3-8 raw data is from TEA's Texas Assessment Research Portal.⁵ This released data is raw assessment data and is not comparable to accountability data tables or Texas Academic Performance Reports (TAPR) from TEA.
- School and Council District Data includes results from 3-8 STAAR subject exams (Reading, Math, Science and Social Studies). This analysis did not include results from STAAR 3-8 Alternate 2 exams or STAAR End of Course exams. STAAR performance standards relate levels of test performance to the expectations defined in the state-mandated curriculum standards, known as the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS). Cut scores distinguish between performance levels.⁶
- The shift to the new Texas Assessment Research Portal removed the ability to automatically aggregate English and Spanish test counts, leading to more masked test counts (counts <10) than in previous years. When test counts at the 'Meets' level are masked, that subset of test counts is also removed from the 'Total Tests' denominator. Year-over-year comparisons use the new portal data for School Year 21-22 through School Year 23-24 from the Texas Assessment Research Portal and previously obtained data from TEA's prior testing portal, Emetric, for School Year 18-19 through School Year 20-21, due to multiple administrations of tests in SY18-19 and 20-21, which exacerbate the masked tests issue.
